**Multi-Agency Active Threat Training**

Kendall County emergency response agencies have come together this month to participate in a joint training exercise in furtherance of enhancing countywide emergency agency interoperability in emergency situations.

Members from the Oswego Police Department, Kendall County Sheriff's Office, Yorkville Police Department, Oswego Fire Protection District and Bristol Kendall Fire Protection District conducted active threat training in early November at the NCG Cinema in Yorkville. Active threat training includes emergency response tactics such as rapid deployment, police and fire department integrated rescue, injured person removal and paramedic medical assistance.

Each of these agencies regularly conducts training to provide their communities with highly trained first responders. Education, planning and training can make a difference towards the prevention of potential violence. The training conducted this month is a great example of multiple agencies being able to pool resources to proactively prepare for emergencies and enhance their working relationships.
